The acknowledgment and reward system implemented at the school further motivates and reinforces positive behaviour. Students are observed and acknowledged for displaying behaviours that align with the school's expectations, and they are rewarded accordingly. In addition to the acknowledgment and reward system, whole school and class lessons are conducted to explicitly teach behaviour expectations. This ensures that students have a clear understanding of what is expected of them in terms of behaviour.
